## Speech by Dr John Sinclair – Chair of the NZCCM Council

It's an honour to attend this graduation, to congratulate the graduating students on their years of hard work and to acknowledge the love and support of the families and friends represented here. Learning is a joint effort and I'm sure the students are deeply appreciative of those who have helped them in this journey that concludes today.
