ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

Applicants must hold the New Zealand Diploma in Wellness and Relaxation Massage (Level5)[NZQA Ref #2740] or can demonstrate international/national equivalent qualification that has been endorsed by professional membership or currency of status through annual practicing certificates.

Minimum 18 years have passed at least NCEA L2 60 credits or equivalent (preferably including Biology).

No communicable disease conditions, or physical or psychological impairments that may adversely affect the ability to undertake a practical and theoretical programme of study, or work with people in a clinical setting.

All applicants must be able to competently communicate in English.

International students, whose first language is not English, must have a minimum overall IELTS (Academic) score of 6.0 with no band lower than 5.5 or equivalent evidence of English language proficiency.

International students must be on shore in Aotearoa New Zealand and study on campus, and complete all immigration requirements including evidence of appropriate medical and travel insurance and a valid Student Visa.
