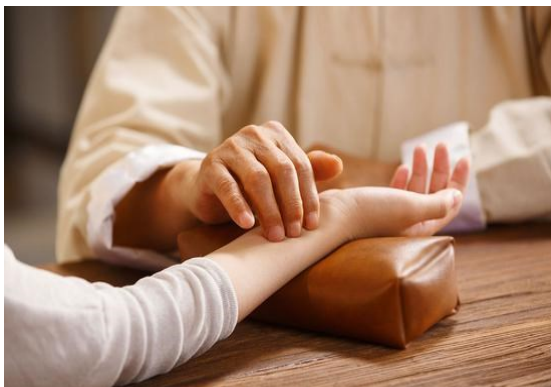

Master of Chinese Medicine

Programme Aims

- Studying theory and skills for specialist practice in acupuncture, herbal medicine, Qi Gong and TCM preventative care.
- Practicing advanced techniques of diagnosis, needling and herbal formulae.
- Exploring the classics of Chinese Medicine and bringing ancient wisdom to clinical practice.
- Learning to use contemporary research integrated with clinical practise, how and when to use it, and how to undertake it for yourself.
- Tailored to the needs and diseases of communities in New Zealand, understanding the local opportunities and challenges, and working with the existing medical provision.
- Graduates from this qualification meet the national registration standard for the scope of Chinese Herbal Medicine Practitioner developed by Chinese Medicine Council of NZ.
- Graduates from this qualification may also apply for registration as Chinese medicine specialists with the Chinese Medicine Council of NZ.

Teaching Method

- The programme is delivered with a combination of online material and weekly video conferences.
- Courses have face to face learning at the Greenlane campus in Auckland. there are two one-week blocks in the first semester, future semester requirements depend on the courses chosen.
- The final semester can be completed as an internship in New Zealand or China, or as your own research project.

The electives in MCM.901 and MCM.902 offers the opportunity for students to complete a 350- hour clinical internship in either the approved off-shore partner hospital in China or a local NZCCM Clinic-Based internship

* There are additional costs associated with the off-shore clinical placement to cover travel and accommodation and any other associated travel costs such as travel and medical insurance, MIQ costs in both countries.

Master Enrolment Requirement

Applicants must hold a bachelor's degree or L7 diploma with either a major in Chinese Medicine or acupuncture with at least 360 credits.

The programme is delivered and assessed in English and so a minimum 6.5 IELTS (Academic) or equivalent is required for non native English speakers..

International students must be based in New Zealand to complete the course.
